## 2 Chiefly Speaking


My Brothers,

# Seven S-4S Arrowmen Receive the Distinguished Service Award



The Order of the Arrow's Distinguished Service Award (DSA) is presented to those Arrowmen who have rendered outstanding service to the Order on a sectional, area, regional, or national basis. The DSA is presented by the National Order of the Arrow Committee every two years, and it is given primarily for dedicated service to the Order and Scouting over a period of time. Only a limited number of awards are presented, and Arrowmen whose service records are the most outstanding and extend the farthest beyond the local lodge level are selected.

Of the 42 DSA's that will be presented at the 2004 NOAC, seven of the honorees are from the lodges of Section S-4S. This is an unprecedented number of DSA's from our section, and we take great pride in recognizing the service of our brothers who are receiving this award. The following Arrowmen from our section will receive the DSA at the Sunday night awards show at NOAC:

**Courtney Allen** of Echockotee Lodge has been involved at the national level since serving as an aide to National Chief Sean Cox in 1992. Courtney was involved in the Quality Program Development program at the 1995 OA Philmont Retreat, and he has served on the housing staff at the past five National Order of the Arrow Conferences. He was also involved in the development of the current National Leadership Seminars program. For the past five years, Courtney has been the adviser to the OA Annual Report, helping to bring the quality of that national publication to its current excellent level.

**Paul Anderson** of O-Shot-Caw Lodge has worked with the American Indian Activities committee at national events since 1990, including NOAC's, National Jamborees, the OA Philmont Retreat and OA Indian Summer. He has served Section S-4S and its predecessors as head judge for



American Indian Activities and as a seminar trainer for many years, and he has helped coordinate the section's OA Philmont Treks. Paul is the director of McGregor Smith Scout Reservation and has been the director of the Southern Region's National Camp School Management and Ranger School Division for over 20 years.

**Chris Crowley** of Tipisa Lodge was the 2001-2002 section S-4S chief and the 2002 National Order of the Arrow Conference vice-chief for shows. Chris was a chapter chief for the OA Service Corps at the 2001 National Scout Jamboree, and he served on the staffs of National Leadership Seminars in 1999, 2001, 2002 and 2003, and of the Southern Region Section Officer Gathering in 2001. In addition to serving Section S-4S as chief, Chris conducted Section Assistance Team visits for three years, and he has been a trainer at section conferences and section seminars since 1998 and at Section 7B's Arrow Heads training event in 2003.

**Nick Digirolamo** of Seminole Lodge was section S-4S chief in 2002, until his election as the national chief of the Order of the Arrow for 2003. Nick serves the Order as a member of the National Order of the Arrow Committee and has been a staff member of nine National Leadership Seminars, four National Lodge Adviser Training Seminars, OA Indian Summer and

the 2002 National Order of the Arrow Conference. Nick has been to OA Trail Crew and OA Wilderness Voyage twice, and he is currently developing the Order's next high adventure program at the Florida Sea Base, which will start next summer. Nick served as a member of the National Executive Board of the Boy Scouts of America, and he delivered the BSA's Report to the Nation to President Bush in 2003.

**Jon Hobbs** is a member of Atta Kulla Kulla Lodge in South Carolina, but he has long been associated with Tipisa Lodge and Section S-4S, so we still claim him as our own. Jon served on the housing staffs of six National Order of the Arrow Conferences, from 1988 through 1998. He then served as the medical director for the National Leadership Summit in 1999, for the NOAC's in 2000 and 2002, for OA Indian Summer in 2003, and for this year's NOAC. Jon has also served on three National Leadership Seminars staffs and on the medical team for the OA Service Corps at the 2001 National Scout Jamboree.

**Stan Hoff** of O-Shot-Caw Lodge has been involved in developing a repository for memorabilia of the Order of the Arrow, helping to coordinate this effort for the National Order of the Arrow Committee. Stan has designed and manufactured many new memorabilia items for sale at National Order of the Arrow conferences and other national events in order to raise money for the repository fund. He has also dedicated his energy and talent to raising money for the Order's endowment fund. At the section level, Stan has been a tireless supporter, providing the awards presented at section conferences for many years.

**Tico Perez** of Tipisa Lodge is the president of Area 4 and a member of the National Order of the Arrow
